

Standard (non-dental) Radiograph Document Preparation

DV or VD	Nose to the top, with the patient's Right side positioned at the Left of the image (as though viewing the ventral surface of the body/head).
Lateral	The head/ nose faces to the left permitting direct comparison of L and R lateral views
L/R markers	Both L and R markers should be used even when only one is technically required. L-R markers should NOT be placed where they obscure useful anatomical detail. Enough of each marker must be visible to clearly identify it.
Cropping	The images should be cropped to remove unnecessary anatomy (i.e. there is no need to show the whole neck, but the whole of the skull and mandible should be included. When cropping images, leave sufficient of both the markers visible for identification of both left and right.
Resolution	Import bitmap (digital or scanned) or high quality JPEG images of about 300dpi (>200 dpi < 400). 25mm = 1 inch requiring 300 pixels to provide adequate resolution for on-screen magnification.
Title	Delete the inappropriate species and replace YYYY-MM-DD with the date the radiographs were obtained.
Images	Replace the modified images below with your unmodified radiographs, scaling them to life size. See the dental radiograph series guidance if you do not know how.
Size	For medium to large breed dogs it will be necessary to change the "paper" size from A4 to A3 (File Menu: Page setup: Paper: Page size)
PDF	Once the document is formatted, delete this guidance text and "print" the document to a PDF file generator (do not save-as PDF). The PDF generator used must be set up in ENGLISH with an anonymous registration name. Check the properties of the PDF document for any compromising text. Save the document with an ENGLISH file name.
